

Credentials are not required to enter the Fairgrounds. Entrants drive to their respective exhibit building, enter items, and leave to accommodate others.

Exhibit Entry:

- Friday, August 1, 11 am 7 pm
- Saturday, August 2, 11 am 7 pm

Exhibit Pick-up:

- Tuesday, September 2, 1 pm 6 pm
- Saturday, September 6, 1 pm 6 pm

Attention Artists: Please note there is a Label Competition in the Craft Beverage Department. Please see their guide at <u>alaskastatefair.org/site/exhibit/craft-beverages/</u>, Division 10 Craft Beverage Label Competition.

Sub-Categories:

Entries from children under 5 years must be entered in Creative Arts & Crafts Department - see Division 11, Class 11. If the sub-category is left blank, entry will be classified as "OPEN".

- A: Junior, ages 5 through 8
- B: Junior, ages 9 through 12
- C: Junior, ages 13 through 17

- O: Open
- P: Professional (sells or instructs Art)

Entries without entrant contact/mailing information will be automatically disqualified and not judged. **All entries must remain on display for the entirety of the Fair**.

JUDGING

The Alaska State Fair uses the American System of judging. Design, composition, originality, creativity, color saturation, value, tone lighting, contrast emotional response, technical expertise, and craftsmanship will all be considerations. All work will be judged on presentation (framing, proper hanging hardware, matting if used, cleanliness).

ENTRY RULES

All artwork entered in the Alaska State Fair must be created by a human
<u>**ABSOLUTELY NO *"text-to-image" entries will be accepted***</u>
This includes, <u>but is not limited to</u>, anything generated with:
Adobe Firefly, MidJourney, Stability Al products, Microsoft Image Creator,
Apple Image Playground, Google Gemini, and/or DALL-E

- Artwork must be your own <u>human-made</u> original art you have made yourself within the past two years (2023 thru 2025)
- Only enter artwork you have not already entered in previous years' Fairs
- Artwork must be dry, within size limits, and ready to hang on our pegboard system with a proper wire hangar (See "SIZE REQUIREMENTS" and "FRAMING AND WIRE HANGAR REQUIREMENTS" sections)
- Only enter one piece of artwork per Class (no competing against yourself!) up to three entries per person. Example: Alice has 3 framed pencil drawings of a bear in the woods, a mountain scene, and a tractor in a Palmer hayfield - only one drawing can be entered per Class, so Alice enters the bear drawing in Class 08: Pencil/Graphite, the mountain scene in Class 13: Alaskana, and the tractor in Class 14: Other
- No "paint-by-numbers" or other purchase-and-complete art kits
- All entries made in an instruction/classroom setting must be entered into Class 12: Workshop

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- Please no political slogans/imagery or nudity such works are prohibited to keep the Alaska State Fair all-inclusive and for all ages
- Artwork and frame only please no glued-on "extras" unless they fit under the frame glass
- Some words are okay, such as signage for ride tickets or boat names, but please limit text/wording to 40% or less of the total artwork exceptions exist for text as a collaged background element, "Fair Fixtures" such as "Become the "I" in "FAIR" exhibit, etc. As much as we love to read, we love to see your artwork more!
- <u>Please avoid pop-culture characters currently under copyright</u> (modern Disney characters, Pokemon, Marvel Superheroes, etc) instead, let's see your "Fakemon" (original creatures in a "Pokemon style"), your own original Superheroes, original characters that would look at home in your favorite "universe", or your own version of characters in the public domain, including Steamboat Willie and Winnie the Pooh (a short list of public domain character-resources/public-domain-characters)
- Please respect any copyrights or Creative Commons license requirements, including attribution/credit, for any reference used. Below are a few public domain image/photography resources that often don't require attribution/credit, including many government agencies and museum collections of historical works of art:

SIZE REQUIREMENTS

No smaller than 8in x 10in or 9in x 9in (18 in perimeter) **including frame/matting** No larger than 24in x 36 in (60 in perimeter) including frame/matting

Measure one "long" side and one "short" side of your entry – the length + width (perimeter) of your entry should not measure more than 60 in, or less than 18 in.

Please make sure all measurements include any framing/matting!

FRAMING AND WIRE HANGAR REQUIREMENTS

<u>Please no "snap fit", "pressure fit" or "front loading" frames!</u> These are often black or white plastic, sold in multi-packs at major stores and have the glass that "pops" out the front and a pop-off frame stand attached to the back. They <u>always</u> crack in the corners and the glass falls out!

Frame only required for: Entries in any Class that is on canvas board/artist panels

Frame and glass are required for:

Entries in any Class that is on paper/paperboard, parchment, etc. Includes: Charcoal, Pencil, Colored Pencil, Ink/Marker, Watercolor, Pastel

Any artwork in any Class created on stretched canvas or wood panels do not require a frame, but **do** require a "gallery wrap" – all sides painted a solid accent color or painted to continue your artwork on all sides – or some sort of "finishing" along the sides to give a nice, gallery-style look, and must be dry and ready to hang on our pegboard system

<u>All entries</u> must be ready to hang with sturdy wire attached solidly and directly to the frame of your artwork using either eye bolts or D-rings as shown below:



Please <u>no</u> sawtooth-style hangars, yarn/thread, fishing wire, "peel-and-stick" hangars, wire attached to the backing board, or stapled/taped wire

REMINDER:

- The superintendent reserves the right to not hang any entry.
- Entries not meeting any and all requirements (including framing requirements) will be disqualified.
- Disqualified entries will not be judged, however, if space permits, they may, in that event, be displayed.
