Entries without entrant contact/mailing information will be automatically disqualified and not judged.

Enter only once per class, except for 'Other' Class in each Division, excluding Divisions 06 & 13. Conform to instructions.

All entries must be grown by exhibitor unless otherwise noted. Refer to "Judging Criteria" and "Definitions" for guidelines. Judging is on market quality. All entries, become the Fair's property, except Division 1 Herbal Window Boxes, Divisions 14,15 Garden Displays, and Giant Pumpkins. All produce is donated to various Community Services, the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center and the Alaska Zoo.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- Division 01-09, 11-15: Market quality, clean, undamaged, uniformity, size, trueness to type and color.
- Division 10, 17: Clean, undamaged, weight or length. Over matured/bolted entries will not be accepted.

DEFINITIONS:

Bunch: Tied market bunch, 1"-2" in diameter for radishes, beet, endive, mustard, spinach, and turnip greens. Tied market bunch, 2"-5" for broccoli, chard, collard greens and kale.

Topped: Removed evenly to within $\frac{1}{2}$ " or as listed per Class guidelines.

Trimmed: Roots and/or stems pared and cut to reasonable length.

Cleaned: No visible soil on leaves, stems, or roots.

Wrapper leaves: Leaves closest to head with a curled edge.

With Stems: Neatly trimmed to $\frac{1}{2}$ - 3", as per Division & Class guidelines.

All divisions are open to ages 6 and above. Age consideration for Juniors (ages 6 to 17) is given only in Divisions 03, 04, 05, 11, 13, 15, 16, 17, and 18. Potato Parade is open to ages 5 and under only. Junior age must be stated on entry form.

Collections require 1/3 - 1/2 cup of each berry, 5 clusters and/or a single layer, conforming to individual Class guidelines. For Junior consideration – indicate sub-category J and state age on entry form. (e.g. J12)

DIVISION 06: POISONOUS & EDIBLE MUSHROOMS

Enter only one species per class, except Class 09 Collections. Include any number of examples, except Class 08 (submit amount listed). Submit your entry in a sturdy, leak-proof container made of wood, plastic, or metal, not cardboard. Your container should not be much larger than one square foot in size, for fairness. Your mushrooms must be fresh and sound. Rotten mushrooms will not be accepted and cannot be judged.

- 08 Cultivated mushrooms: Button (6), Oyster (2), Portabello (2), Shiitake (2), Hericium (2), etc.; anything cultivated from spawn or spore. Display in provided container. Hallucinogenic species are not accepted.

Tips on how to make your Division 06 entry competitive:

- Include some of the original substrate where it grew.
- Include a brief write-up on a 3 x 5 card, describing common or "folk" name if known, habitat and substrate where found, interesting facts and uses, including edibility if known.
- For cultivated species, indicate method of propagation, e.g. if it was grown from a kit, spawn, spores, or pieces of other mushrooms.
- Extra points: a spore print
- Extra points: correctly name and label the scientific genus and species, and variety in the case of cultivated mushrooms.
- Extra points: admit you don't know the name; wild guesses cost points.

One entry per class, except Class 20 Other - 3 allowed per entrant. Submit all with stems and sample of foliage/leaves. Class 01 – 08 and 10-18 must enter the same variety. Class 19 must be named varieties and can be all apples or any combination of apples & fruits.


